PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activities of the Company during the financial year were;

AGED CARE FACILITY

Booroongen Djugun Aged Care Facility was officially opened in early 1997 and currently offers 20 low level care beds and 40 high level care beds. The facility was established to provide care to Aboriginal frail aged, aged and people with a disability, who could not be cared for in the community. Each person at the Aged Care Facility is individually assessed and their care provided based on such individual requirements. The facility is unique and offers a high standard of care to all residents. The facility includes traditional areas with cultural significance, such as:

- · Goanna pond and areas of still water
- Destination walks
- · A serpent park of bush medicines and bush tucker
- Doorway to the Dreamtime, a special room for palliative care use.

Booroongen Djugun Aged Care Facility employs over 70 well trained and qualified staff, capable of providing a high standard of service to the residents in the facility. A Registered Nurse is available 24 hours per day, as well as a team of Enrolled Nurses, Assistants in Nursing, Activities Officers and Ancillary Workers. The staff are committed to caring for the residents in a professional manner.

COLLEGE

The Booroongen Djugun College is a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) that conducts courses that are industry approved and nationally recognised. The College is staffed by highly qualified and experienced educators and trainers and offers accredited courses and The financial Statements should be read in conjunction with the attached Independent Auditors Report.

traineeships.

Courses are conducted on the College's Kempsey campus and also at other outreach centres throughout New South Wales, Australia.

Our courses have been especially developed for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) students and are Abstudy approved (for people who are eligible). Courses have been developed so that students who experience learning difficulties in relation to literacy and numeracy can achieve their maximum potential.

OTHER SERVICES INCLUDE

- Natural Resource, Conservation, Land Management & Heritage: With the
 establishment of an Aboriginal 'Land Care' business, Booroongen Djugun Aboriginal
 Corporation (BDAC) employs Aboriginal people to work on natural resource,
 conservation and heritage management projects and contracts and fulfil the long held
 vision of its Elders Council for Aboriginal employment in such work.
- Making Tracks Together: A Grass Roots Approach is a partnership with youth and Community to provide support and intervention for youth 'at risk'
- Community Aged Care Packages: are provided to Aboriginal aged, frail aged, and people with a disability to support the person with day-to-day living skills. Level of need of the client is identified by the Aged Care Assessment Team (ACAT) as necessary for that person to remain living independently in the community.
- Booroongen Djugun Aboriginal Home and Community Care provides support and
 practical assistance for Aboriginal people who are aged, frail aged, have a disability or
 are disadvantaged, to enable them to live as normal a life as possible within their
 community. The service aims to prevent the premature entry into institutionalised care of
 Aboriginal people.
- Booroongen Djugun Respite Service support people with a disability by giving regular or short-term breaks for carers and families, providing care in the community, and responding to emergency situations or difficulties.
- Booroongen Djugun Aboriginal Wheels to Meals provides food to Aboriginal people who are aged, frail aged, people with a disability and are disadvantaged. Outreach Food Services are delivered into the Bowraville, Wauchope, Bellbrook, and Greenhill Aboriginal communities. BDAC support staff help serve the meals and offer additional assistance, if required. These services ensures access to nutritionally balance meals to improve the health status and lengthen the life span of Aboriginal people.
- Booroongen Djugun Aged Housing allows independent living on site adjunct to other BDAC services.
- Regional Aboriginal HACC Development and Support Service's (RAHACC DSS)
 primary focus is to develop mechanisms to improve the access to, and effectiveness of,
 both Aboriginal specific services and non-Aboriginal services by Aboriginal communities.
 The worker identifies needs and implement strategies to develop and support existing as
 well as new HACC services. RHACC DSS's primary aim is to ensure necessary
 integration and coordination of HACC services to Aboriginal people in their communities.

- The Home and Community Care (HACC) Aboriginal Volunteer Program prepares Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) people for tomorrow's work force through training and volunteer programs. Each volunteer receives OHS and First Aid training. The main aim of the program is to:
 - o recruit and train ATSI people into volunteering with host employers
 - to provide ATSI people with FREE formal qualifications
 - o to ensure volunteers are suitably trained in industry skills that will enable them to become competitive in the job market
 - and most importantly, to enhance the independence of the ATSI frail aged, aged and people with a disability in the community by providing volunteer support services
- Aboriginal Housing Provider of houses in the Kempsey Shire managed specifically for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families.
- Aboriginal Funeral and Information Service assists grieving families during the bereavement period.
- Aboriginal Enterprise Development Officer (AEDO) program; assists the establishment and retention of viable, locally designed Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander business, and encourage a commercial culture within Aboriginal communities.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES

No significant change in the nature of those activities occurred during the year.

OPERATING RESULT

The Profit / (Loss) for the year amounted to \$170,090.85 (2013 \$(474,292.88))
